

We all have dreams. For some, those dreams may be of fame or fortune. But for others, they are much simpler. Some people just want to feel better and be well.

Just ask John, who attends Mission of Mercy's mobile dental clinic in Gettysburg.

John is in his 70s and has been on dialysis for 10 years. He desperately hopes for a kidney transplant, but could not be considered a candidate until his severe oral issues were resolved. Unfortunately, this would require the extraction of 13 teeth, and as a retiree with no dental insurance, John realized that paying \$200 to \$300 per tooth extraction would be impossible on his budget.

Then he found Mission of Mercy and his dream began to unfold.

The medical and dental teams collaborated to ensure that John could receive the oral care he needed. Dr. Roslyn Kellum, Mission of Mercy's dental director, ordered bloodwork to ensure that John's blood would clot properly, since dentists who treat dialysis patients on blood thinners must have medical clearance to ensure their patients' safety during and after dental procedures.

With the assurance that he could safely undergo extractions, John visited Mission of Mercy's mobile dental clinic after his regular



dialysis treatments, and with the approval of his medical team, had his problem teeth extracted over the course of a five-month span.

He had his 13th tooth pulled in October and his pressing oral health issues have been resolved. And because of Mission of Mercy's comprehensive care, his overall health has improved as well. "John also had acute acne prior to his extractions, and now his face is clear, and his health and well-being have improved dramatically," said Dr. Roslyn Kellum, Mission of Mercy's dental director.

John is now eligible for a kidney transplant and has begun the paperwork to make his dream a reality. If all goes well, he hopes to get his new kidney by the end of the year.

Throughout his journey, John, Dr. Kellum and the Mission of Mercy staff have become very close. They all hope to reconnect after John has recovered from his transplant so they can celebrate his long-awaited dream-come-true with him!

As a 23-year-old, Barb Rebele, accompanied her mother, who was battling lupus, on frequent hospital visits. She clearly recalls the stream of physicians flowing in and out of her mother's room, checking her chart, sharing medical updates, and then leaving. Although they helped treat her mother's disease, Barb was left with the nagging question, "But who really cares about my mother"?

That nagging sense that something was missing in healthcare was what led Barb to pursue a career in the field. She would go on to become a physician's assistant as well as a medical technologist, working for 10 years in a hospital chemistry lab. She also served as an employee health coordinator for Bon Secours Hospital.

Then she came to Mission of Mercy.

"The reason I so enjoyed being a part of Mission of Mercy for the past 13 years was because it was nice to be working with an organization where I could take extra time with patients, be empathetic and give personalized treatment," she said. "I could really show patients that I cared, especially while treating those with mental health issues, since one of my family members has suffered from depression for years."

During her time with Mission of Mercy, Barb was especially touched by, and gravitated to, immigrants who were understandably depressed as they had no friends, family or people to share their troubles with.

Barb also admits that her work in Mission of Mercy's mobile clinics gave her the opportunity to meet and to befriend patients with varied backgrounds, like those with tattoos and piercings. "I learned how to treat everyone with mercy and grace and not to judge them," she said.

With her retirement in June of this year, Barb leaves behind a healthcare environment that she will never forget. "I worked in multiple places, but Mission of Mercy was the best place with the best people," she said. "I will miss Dr. Sullivan, and Dave and Maureen Liddle, along with the rest of the staff and volunteers. God prepared me for, and guided me to, Mission of Mercy. It was truly my dream job!"
